NOTE FROM THE CHAIR

This year marks a transformative milestone in Nyaya Health Nepal's mission to advance health as a human right. Guided by Article 35 of the Constitution of Nepal, which guarantees every citizen the right to free basic healthcare and aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being) NHN has completed the second strategic handover of a hospital, its integrated healthcare delivery Achham model to the Sudurpaschim Provincial Government.

After 17 years providing no-cost, high-quality care to the underserved populations of Achham and far-western Nepal, NHN formally transitioned Bayalpata Hospital and its entire ecosystem of care to the Ministry of Social Development (MoSD), Sudurpaschim Province. This follows the earlier handover of Pashupati Chaulagain Hospital in Dolakha to Bagmati Province in 2020, making it NHN's second successful transition under its Design-Build-Operate-Transfer (DBOT) model.

But these handovers are not endpoints but lay foundations for broader impact. NHN model proves that equitable, digitally enabled, community-integrated healthcare is not just a vision, but a scalable reality in Nepal's most remote regions in providing quality care.

In the past year, NHN recorded:

- 67,131 patient visits served through facility-based care in Achham
- 154,726 home visits by our Community Health Workers reaching 40,000 individuals with maternal, child. and chronic disease care
- 844 major surgeries (Including 112 orthopedic, 2 Hip Replacement) and 66 cesarean deliveries performed annually at Bayalpata Hospital
- Digital Health Expansion: Deployed customized open-source Electronic Health Record (EHR) system
 across multiple partner hospitals and in partnership with MoSD Karnali Province, supporting
 government-led efforts in healthcare digitization.

Backed by a data-driven, equity-focused strategy, Nyaya Health Nepal is ready to scale this proven model to new geographies. With the support of visionary partners, we seek to expand to underserved municipalities in other parts of Nepal, bridging the urban-rural health divide and ensuring that no one is left behind in Nepal's journey toward universal health coverage.

Let us build the future of rural healthcare in Nepal together.

Note from Management

Seventeen Years of Impact - A Future of Possibility in Rural Healthcare

Transforming healthcare in remote regions has been Nyaya Health Nepal's mission since 2008. Bayalpata Hospital Program was formally handed over to the Sudurpaschim Province effective 17 August 2025.

In the past 17 years, NHN's work has directly contributed to saving thousands of lives by delivering timely emergency, maternal, surgical, and chronic disease care to Nepal's most vulnerable communities.

Looking ahead, NHN is scaling this proven model of integrated municipal healthcare across Nepal. The Electronic Health Record (EHR) system is now operational in eight district hospitals across Karnali Province, as well as in Bayalpata Provincial Hospital (Achham) Pashupati Chaulagain Hospital (Charikot, Dolakha) Aampipal Hospital (Gorkha) and Wanchhu Memorial Hospital (Solukhumbu). A major bound forward has been the successful integration of NHN-EHR system with Nepal's national health insurance system, enhancing transparency, continuity of care, and financial protection for patients.

Empowered by the trust of the communities, the commitment of the government, and the support of philanthropic partners, NHN is moving forward to scale up impact to expand into new areas and continue providing lifesaving, quality healthcare to those who need it most in rural Nepal.

NHN – Achham Program: Impact (2008–2025)

Since 2008, Nyaya Health Nepal's program in Achham has demonstrated what is possible when global health innovation meets grassroots level commitment. What began as a transformation of a run-down health post has evolved into the 50-bed Bayalpata Hospital, providing completely free care under NHN management till 16 August 2025, comprehensive care across all services, serving as a national and global model of equitable healthcare.

Over the last 17 years, the hospital has delivered care to over 1,032,919 million patients, including major surgeries and cesarean sections annually, and played a crucial role in reducing barriers to maternal and emergency care in the most underserved



and remote region of rural Nepal. NHN has consistently met and often exceeded key health indicators, such as achieving a 98% institutional birth rate, maintaining a surgical complication rate below 5%, and reaching a contraceptive prevalence rate of 60%, all while operating in an isolated, resource-constrained environment.

Facility-Based Care

Nyaya Health Nepal's Bayalpata Hospital treated around 70,000 patients in 2025 alone. The hospital is now run by the Ministry of Social Development (MoSD), Sudurpaschim Province. Bayalpata Hospital continues to operate under NHN's technical assistance model to ensure uninterrupted quality care. The hospital has provided a wide range of essential health services, including:



- General outpatient care
- Surgical services, including orthopedic procedures and the first hip replacement in the region
- Maternal and neonatal care, contributing to a 98% institutional birth rate
- Emergency care, including trauma and acute medical conditions
- Chronic disease management for conditions like hypertension and diabetes

This facility stands as a national model for integrated, dignified, and equity-driven healthcare in rural Nepal.

Community Health Program

- Households Reached: Overall, 1,276,710 and 150,000+ annual
- Community Health Workers Trained: 100+
- Focus Areas: RMNCH (Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn and Child Health), chronic disease management, referral support



Bayalpata Hospital Handover to Sudurpaschim Province "From Innovation to Government Ownership"

The handover of Bayalpata Hospital to the provincial government marks a historic milestone in NHN's 17-year journey of transforming rural healthcare in Nepal, built on a pioneering Public–Private Partnership (PPP) model with the Government of Nepal.

Located in Achham district, the hospital is now a national model for high-quality, integrated healthcare, improving access to lifesaving services across some of Nepal's most remote and underserved regions. NHN's impact



extended beyond clinical care, encompassing capacity building, infrastructure modernization, and digital transformation through the launch and scale-up of a customized EHR system, first deployed at Bayalpata Hospital in 2016.



The handover reflects a transition not just of management, but of systems, innovation, and legacy. With key hospital staff integrated into the provincial structure for sustainability, and local ownership. This moment signifies NHN's strategic shift from direct service delivery to system strengthening, demonstrating how NGO-led innovation, when built with government alignment, can scale into long-term impact.

Bayalpata Hospital now stands as a replicable model for decentralized, equitable rural healthcare, and a symbol of what's possible through data-driven, and community-centered partnerships.

Key Impacts of Bayalpata Hospital Under NHN Leadership (2008–2025)

1. Service Delivery & Health Outcomes

- 1,032,919 total patients served in Achham alone (of 1,328,805 visits NHN-wide since 2008)
- Average 62,000+ outpatient visits annually
- 8,449 total deliveries with a 98% institutional birth rate, significantly lowering maternal and neonatal mortality
- 5,584 major surgeries performed with <5% complication rate (well below WHO threshold)
- Over average 150,000 community health worker home visits per year, totaling 1,276,710 visits to date
- Lifesaving care delivered free of charge, eliminating financial barriers for the poor



- Launched NepalEHR at Bayalpata Hospital in 2015, one of the first rural-ready Electronic Health Record systems in Nepal
- Digitized clinical documentation, diagnostics, pharmacy, billing, and follow-up care
- Ensured continuity of care, improved patient safety, and enabled real-time data for clinical governance and planning

- Trained hundreds of Doctors, Nurses, Paramedics, and CHWs in clinical and digital skills

4. Systems Change & Government Partnership

- Pioneered a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model in rural healthcare with alignment across local, provincial, and federal governments
- Transitioned hospital staff and leadership into provincial government systems
- Transition aligned with Article 35 of the Constitution, SDG 3 (Health) and SDG 5 (Gender Equality)









5. Community Impact

- Provided healthcare access to Achham and neighboring districts (Doti, Bajura, Bajhang, Dadeldhura and some districts of Karnali Province)
- Strengthening community health literacy, trust in the public system, and reduced outmigration for care
- Played a crucial role in COVID-19 response through testing, treatment, and public awareness



Japanese Government Support

Medical Equipment Handover at Bayalpata Provincial Hospital



Through the generous support of the Japanese Government's Grant Assistance for Grassroots Projects (GGP), Nyaya Health Nepal strengthened healthcare infrastructure at Bayalpata Provincial Hospital by upgrading its diagnostic and surgical capabilities. This collaboration enabled the hospital to receive essential medical equipment, including a C-Arm, Portable Ultrasound (USG), and Digital X-ray system, which have now been officially handed over to the Sudurpaschim Provincial Government to ensure continuity of services.

This advanced equipment is transforming healthcare delivery for communities in Achham, Doti, Bajura, and parts of Karnali Province, enhancing the hospital's capacity to provide comprehensive diagnostic and surgical care locally. With this support, patients in these underserved districts no longer need to travel long distances for specialized



services, ensuring better access, improved quality of care, and healthier outcomes. The partnership with the Government of Japan demonstrates how international collaboration can sustainably strengthen rural health systems in Nepal.

When Dr. Mandeep Pathak joined Bayalpata Hospital in 2015, he brought not only advanced orthopedic expertise but also dedication to serving communities by specialized surgical care. Over the years, he has delivered hundreds of essential procedures from managing complex trauma and severe fractures to leading the first-ever total hip replacement in rural Far West Nepal. Since 2020, Dr. Pathak has played a pivotal role in strengthening emergency and surgical systems, enhancing infection prevention practices, and supporting the integration of NHN's digital electronic health record.

Following years of dedicated service and leadership, Dr. Pathak has been appointed as an Executive Director of Bayalpata Provincial Hospital under the Provincial Government of Sudurpaschhim. Bayalpata Hospital Legacy

In August 2025, Nyaya Health Nepal officially handed over Bayalpata Hospital to the Sudurpaschim Province government. But instead of being the conclusion of nearly two decades in Achham, it marks the beginning of a new era. NHN will build on the foundation of learning, experience, innovation and collaboration with the people of western Nepal, medical practitioners and local governments. The systems, skills, and values developed with NHN's partnership ensure that Bayalpata Hospital, just like the 2020 handover of Charikot Hospital to Bagmati Province, will thrive within Nepal's evolving federal health structure.

This year's annual report also celebrates the individuals who shaped Bayalpata's pioneering journey. Founders, former staff, and long-time partners have shared their reflections and memories testimonials that capture the spirit of service, dedication, and community that defined Bayalpata Hospital. Their voices honor the collective effort that transformed a small health post into a 50-bed hospital ensuring equitable care and a symbol of what is possible when compassion, partnership, and purpose guide public health innovation.

DIGITAL HEALTH SYSTEM EXPANSION - KEY IMPACTS

Successful EHR Pilots:

Initiated and demonstrated impact of Bahmni-based Electronic Health Record (EHR) system in 2016 at:

- Bayalpata Hospital and Chaurmandu Primary Health Center, Achham
- Pashupati Chaulagain Hospital, Charikot, Dolakha



System Scale-Up:

Expanded the customized EHR system to all 8 district hospitals of Karnali Province with Abt Associates under a USAID-funded initiative, in partnership with the Ministry of Social Development (MoSD), Karnali Province.

Additionally, the system has been successfully deployed at Aampipal Hospital (Gorkha), Aambukhareni Municipal Hospital (Tanahun), and Wangchu Memorial Hospital (Solukhumbu), extending impact beyond NHN managed hospital and Karnali Province.

Capacity Strengthening:

Conducted comprehensive training for clinical, lab, pharmacy, billing, inventory, insurance, and DHIS2 reporting teams at each facility.

Sustained Operations:

Ensured continuity and sustainability through ongoing technical assistance and Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs) with partner hospitals.

Strengthened Health Governance:

Established strong digital health governance in Karnali Province, aligning with national strategies and priorities.

Provincial Data Infrastructure Development:

Initiated planning for a provincial data depot and aggregated health dashboard to track real-time key health indicators.

National Alignment and Scalability:

The initiative supports the Digital Nepal Framework and National Digital Health Strategy, offering a scalable model for nationwide replication.



Capacity-Building Intervention for Frontline Health Workers in Roshi Municipality post-2024 Floods

In the aftermath of the devastating September 2024 floods in Bagmati Province, Nyaya Health Nepal (NHN), with funding support from ANMF, implemented a targeted capacity-building intervention to strengthen the resilience of frontline health systems in Roshi Rural Municipality. With communities facing heightened risks of mental health challenges and waterborne diseases, NHN conducted a comprehensive two-day Motivational Interviewing (MI) training for 21 frontline health workers,



including 16 FCHVs and 5 ANMs from the most affected wards. The training enhanced their ability to provide concerned, patient-centered mental health support, understand behavioral change stages, and promote essential WASH practices, equipping them to respond effectively to post-disaster needs in their communities.

Alongside these skill-building efforts, NHN addressed critical gaps in water safety within local health facilities by distributing four high-quality water purifiers to health posts and one to the municipal health coordination division. This support ensured reliable access to safe drinking water for both patients and staff, strengthening public health protection following the floods. Together, these interventions reinforced community-level mental health support, improved health awareness, and enhanced preparedness against future health risks, contributing to a more resilient and responsive local health system in Roshi Rural Municipality.

HOSPITAL-BASED CARE A Surgical Milestone: Expanding Access to Advanced Orthopedic Care

Nyaya Health Nepal through Bayalpata Hospital achieved a major milestone by successfully performing its first-ever total hip joint replacement surgery in rural Far West Nepal. Niroj Bhul, a 30-yearold from Bayalpata Bazar, had lived with chronic pain for years, unable to access or afford advanced care. Thanks to the dedication of Dr. Mandeep Pathak and a skilled surgical team including orthopedic experts from Kathmandu, orthopedic surgeon Dr. Bhaskar Raj Pant and orthopedic surgeon Dr. Sandip Bhandari. Niroj received the life-changing operation free of cost and was able to walk the very next day. A second patient, 72-year-old Chandrakala Khadka, also undertook a successful partial hip replacement after a fall, both cases demonstrating the hospital's growing capacity to deliver complex surgical interventions in one of the country's most remote regions.



These landmark surgeries are more than medical success stories of rural Nepal they are powerful reminders of what's possible when quality healthcare is made accessible to everyone, regardless of income or location.

COMMUNITY VISIT CARE



Empowering Safe Motherhood Nyaya Health Nepal's Community Care Saves Lives

Tika Bohara, 27-year-old mother from Ward 4, Chaurpati Rural Municipality, expresses the life-changing impact of NHN's community healthcare intervention in Achham. Expecting her second child, Tika was carefully monitored throughout her pregnancy by a dedicated Community Health Worker (CHW) of Nyaya Health Nepal.

Despite medical advice to remain hospitalized at 40 weeks of pregnancy, Tika initially chose to return home. When her labor had not begun even after 43 weeks, a follow-up home visit by the CHW revealed she had severe oligohydramnios, a dangerous condition marked by critically low amniotic fluid. Referring again to the hospital, Tika initially left before completing necessary pre-operative tests, putting both her and her baby at risk.

Thanks to the persistent efforts of the NHN healthcare team and timely counseling by the CHW during a home visit, Tika returned to the hospital. On 1st Shrawan 2082, she safely delivered a healthy baby girl via cesarean section. Both mother and newborn were stable and blooming, evidence to the crucial role of community health workers in bridging gaps and ensuring safe deliveries in remote areas like Achham.

This case highlights Nyaya Health Nepal's vital contribution to maternal and neonatal health in Achham where persistent community engagement and healthcare outreach saved life in presence of NHN program.

Digitizing Rural Healthcare: Transforming Service Delivery and Strengthening Real-Time Reporting through NHN-EHR system in rural Nepal

From System Failure to Financial Recovery: The Role of NHN-EHR in Strengthening a Rural District Hospital in Karnali Province

Last year, a major server crash at the Nepal Health Insurance Board erased nearly six months of claims nationwide, leaving hundreds of hospitals struggling to recreate and resubmit thousands of records within 15 days, a challenging task for those relying on paper-based systems, many of whom suffered severe financial losses. In contrast, Mehelkuna Hospital in Surkhet, Karnali Province, demonstrated remarkable resilience due to support from Nyaya Health Nepal's Health Insurance Integrated



Electronic Health Record (EHR) system and continuous technical support, which ensured that all diagnoses, investigations, prescriptions, and claim files were securely stored and instantly accessible. As a result, the hospital successfully resubmitted nearly 40,000 claims and safeguarded NPR 80 lakh in revenue, showcasing the important role NHN's digital system and technical assistance play in strengthening healthcare financing, ensuring data integrity, reducing administrative burden, and building a more resilient digital health system for Nepal.

"Because of this system and NHN's continuous technical support, we were able to resubmit all our claims on time. EHR system protected us from losing nearly 80 lakhs of about 40,000 claims. Without it, the hospital would have suffered a destructive financial crisis. While hundreds of hospitals struggled, Mehelkuna Hospital successfully recovered all its claims.

Enhancing Community Health through Digital Innovation EHR Journey at Pashupati Chaulagain Memorial Hospital, Charikot, Dolakha



Since the handover of Pashupati Chaulagain Memorial Hospital in 2020 from Nyaya Health Nepal to Bagmati Province, the continued technical support from Nyaya Health Nepal has ensured the smooth implementation and sustainability of the Electronic Health Record (EHR) system.

The impact of the EHR system is particularly marked in the Maternal and Child Health (MCH) department, where frontline providers like Pratima Bhattarai, Sr. ANM, have seen a meaningful transformation in the way healthcare services are delivered.

"Since we started using the EHR system, our work has become much easier. Generating monthly reports is now quick and hassle-free. Even when patients lose their cards, we can easily access their previous medical records. This has really helped us manage our daily duties moreefficiently and provide better care."

Improving Maternal Health Outcomes through Real-Time EHR Dashboards

At Dailekh Hospital, the introduction of the Electronic Health Record (EHR) system, developed and customized by Nyaya Health Nepal (NHN), has led to measurable improvements in maternal healthcare delivery. By enabling real-time tracking of key maternal health indicators through an integrated hospital dashboard, frontline clinical teams can now make data-informed decisions that directly enhance patient care.



One of the most significant outcomes has been the timely prevention of postpartum hemorrhage (PPH), one of the leading causes of maternal mortality in Nepal. The live dashboard provides immediate data following delivery, ensuring consistent adherence to evidence-based clinical protocols for PPH prevention. This data-driven approach has resulted in a significant reduction in PPH cases, contributing to safer deliveries and better maternal outcomes.

The dashboard's visual, user-friendly interface has also empowered nurse-midwives and physicians to identify service gaps, monitor trends, and take proactive action. This has fostered a culture of accountability, teamwork, and continuous quality improvement within the hospital.

The success at Dailekh Hospital demonstrates how EHR-driven dashboards can transform service delivery even in resource-limited settings, offering a scalable model for strengthening Nepal's public health system through digital innovation and real-time data use.



Reliable Tech with Responsive Team How EHR is Powering Patient Care at Aampipal Hospital

Over the past five years, Aampipal Hospital has been using Nyaya Health Nepal Electronic Health Record (NHN-EHR) system, and the impact on our operations has been transformative. The system is user-friendly, integrated, and supports a fully paperless workflow, enabling quick and efficient access to comprehensive patient histories.

This digital shift has significantly boosted our operational efficiency. Patients no longer need to carry physical documents, and our clinical teams can easily retrieve accurate medical histories at the point of care. NHN - EHR has become an essential tool for ensuring continuity and quality in healthcare delivery.

Like any system, we have encountered occasional technical issues, such as slow loading times, incomplete visibility of previous diagnoses, and minor syncing delays between modules like lab and radiology. However, these have been minimal in comparison to the overall benefits.





Income by Sources




Income by Type




■ Health Insurance & Other Income


Expenditure by Types




Sector and Service wise expenditure
